<p>(Anemone canadensis) Windflower</p> <p>This super-hardy native ground cover plant can be found all the way up to the arctic circle. Loads and loads of white flowers May through June. A robust plant good for the woods' edge or in meadow gardens. Moist to average soils. Grows about 18 inches tall. Sun to shade.</p>	<p>moist soil</p> <p>Shade - Sun</p> <p>Good Native Ground Cover</p>
<p>(Asarum canadense) Wild ginger</p> <p>An easy, tolerant plant that makes a good ground cover. Its bold, heart-shaped leaves create a pleasing texture in the garden. The roots smell very much like ginger, though this plant is not related to culinary ginger. Wild ginger has interesting triangular flowers that hide under the plant's leaves in the spring. <p>(Podophyllum Peltatum) Mayapple</p> <p>The Mayapple have distinctive stalked pairs of leafs that provides a wonderful covering for low hanging white blooms in the spring that develop into yellow plum like pods. Mayapples will form large colonies in partial shade wooded conditions. <p>(Tiarella cordifolia) Foamflower</p> <p>Foamflower's charms have just recently begun to be appreciated by gardeners and plants breeders. Foamflower has spikes of fluffy white flowers that rise above a carpet of soft green leaves. It blooms strongly in late spring. (Size 3-10")</p>	<p>average to moist soil</p> <p>Shade - Part Sun</p> <p>Good Companions Woodland Phlox or Trout Lily</p>
<p>(Trillium erectum) Red Trillium</p> <p>The Wake Robin or Red Trillium is a spring ephemeral wildflower with the color of rich burgundy wine. The distinctive three-petaled flower comes up in early spring before the deciduous trees leaf out. The trillium's foliage eventually goes dormant by mid summer. Does well in woodland edges, with moist soils. Reaches 6 to 20 inches.</p>	<p>moist soil</p> <p>Part Shade</p> <p>A Good Companions Woods Poppy or Wild Geranium</p>

(Aquilegia canadensis) Wild Columbine

Dry to moist soil
Sun

Dainty, nodding red and orange flowers on tall, open plants make a graceful display in the garden or bouquet. The complex, five-tailed or spurred flowers are sophisticated hummingbird feeders. Each of the spurs contains a pulse of nectar accessible only to the birds or butterflies with suitably long tongues. Let these plants go to seed and watch for the small seedlings the following year. (Size 12-16")

(Echinacea purpurea) Purple Cone Flower

Dry to moist soil
Sun

The Purple Cone Flower has abundant flowers that attract butterflies to summer gardens. Beautiful in perennial, wildflower, cutting or mixed gardens. Attractive when planted with monarda, daisies, phlox, liatris or ornamental grasses. Will tolerate periods of drought. Blooms mid-summer to early fall and grows to 36 inches.

(Phlox stolonifera) 'Home Fire' – Red Creeping Phlox

moist soil
Sun to Part Shade

A smaller, early phlox, with red flowers. A good addition to beds with sun to part sun and average soil. One of the first to brighten up gardens and rock walls in early spring. May be used as a ground cover or garden accent. Reaches 5 to 8 inches tall.

(Tradescantia) 'Sweet Kate' - Spiderwort

moist to dry soil
Sun - Part Shade

'Sweet Kate' is a native cultivar that is compact, clump-forming and noted for its purple flowers and yellow green foliage. Numerous flower buds form on each stalk with each individual flower lasting for one day from May to July. When individual stems are cut the sap becomes thread-like and silky upon hardening (like a spider's web) hence the common name. (Size 9-12")

(Polystichum acrostichoides) Christmas Fern

Moist to dry soil
Shade to Part Sun

The Christmas fern is a robust evergreen plant, easily grown in diverse habitats. It gets its common name from the fact that early European settlers used it for Christmas decoration. Although the Christmas fern likes moist soil best, it will also grow among rocks or dry slopes. (Size 12-24")

Add something special to your patio, porch or sunny office window with these low maintenance and attractive "Hens and Chicks" 8" round, 4" deep earth toned planters. The planters contain 3 or 4 different varieties of sempervivum (depending on size), are decorated with local stone, glass beads or other materials. No two are alike! After the growing season you can move them indoors, leave in a cold place like a garage or plant in your garden and they will over winter. These hardy perennials thrive in part to full sunny, have low water needs and tolerate many soil conditions.
